# PHOTOMARATHON 2014

## RULES.

1. Take 1 photo for each of the 12 themes in the order that they are given.
2. Cameras that do not contain 12 photographs or do not have all 12 themes photographed in the correct order will be disqualified. Allowances may be made at the discretion of the organisers if there is a technical fault with the camera.
3. You must collect the topics, in person, at the given times.
4. To qualify for final judging your entry card has to be stamped by one of the Photomathon officials upon collection of each new set of topics and on returning your camera.
5. Themes will not be published on the festival website, through Twitter, Facebook or any other social media, and will not be given out over the phone or by text message.
6. Participants must return their completed cameras before 5.00pm on Saturday 13 September to qualify for judging.
7. All photographs must be taken on the day of the Photomathon and between 10am and 5pm.
8. Participants must use the provided cameras.
9. All images must be taken on the same camera.
10. You are free to use flash guns, tripods, filters or any other related equipment.

## GOOD PRACTICE

1. If taking pictures of children, ask permission from their parent/carer and explain what you are taking the photograph for and that it will be included in a public exhibition as part of the 2014 Guernsey Photography Festival.
2. Respect people's right to privacy and don't make anybody the focus of your picture without their permission. Consent is not required from people in the background or in a crowd.
3. Respect property - you are allowed to take any photograph while standing on public property, but owners have the right to restrict you from taking photos while standing on their private property (this includes land and inside buildings).

## TERMS & CONDITIONS

1. Participation in the competition signifies the agreement and acceptance of the Terms & Conditions as listed.
2. Competitors take part at their own risk. Guernsey Photography Festival takes no responsibility for personal injury, lost or damaged film, cameras or equipment during the Photomathon.
3. The organisers reserve the right to disqualify any participant who has infringed any of the Photomathon rules.
4. The Guernsey Photography Festival reserves the right to publish pictures taken by entrants in its programme, website and in all media for the purposes of documentation and promotion of the Guernsey Photomathon. Copyright of the photographs remains with the photographer, and all negatives will be returned to the entrants after the event.
5. The Photomathon is open to anyone. Young people under the age of 18 must provide written consent from their parent or guardian to take part. The Guernsey Photography Festival cannot take responsibility for the supervision of children during this event and would therefore recommend that children under the age of 14 are accompanied by an adult.
6. The organisers will be taking photographs throughout the day as a record of the event. They may be used on our website blog, in our publications or to publicise future events. If you do not wish to be photographed or filmed it is your responsibility to contact us prior to the event.
7. Guernsey Photography Festival cannot take responsibility for the content or distribution of any photography or filming taken during the day by participants or third parties.
8. To qualify as a participant you must register and pay the entry fee.
9. Guernsey Photography Festival will only use the information you provide to us to administer our events and we will not pass on your details to any third parties. Your information will be processed fairly and lawfully in accordance with the Data Protection (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2001.
10. Decisions made by the organisers and judges are final.
